PRESIDENT'S REPORT 2011/2012

It is with my greatest pleasure that I write my 2nd President's report on what is truly a remarkable season for the Club.

We had 4 Premierships –

1st Grade - our first since 1945/46

4th Grade - our first since the competition was formed in 1982/83

Without your support, the Club would not be able to ensure we have the best equipment and facilities, and be involved in infrastructure projects such as the Longueville nets.

To the Selection Committee which comprised of John Lloyd Chairman of Selectors, Brett Richardson 1st grade captain, Sam Mantarro 2nd grade captain, Geof Sundstrom 3rd grade captain, Bryan Dempsey 4th grade captain, Steve Campbell 5th grade captain and Sam Cox Under 24's captain: thank you for all your hard work and time spent over the season ensuring we also had full teams every weekend. I hate to think how many phone calls and emails were made during the season to get 55 players on the field.

The Club for the first time in its history had 4 teams in semi finals and finished 3rd in the Club Championship. As mention earlier, 1st Grade won their first Premiership since 1945/46 and with that became the first 1st Grade team to win a grand final. They performed under extreme pressure in the semi final and the grand final to post scores of over 300. They never doubted each other and were wonderfully lead by their captain and club stalwart Brett Richardson. Richie Gallichan won the Peter Toohey Medal for player of the grand final with 119 off the bat and 2/53 with the ball.

4th Grade won the club's first 4th Grade Premiership since the competition was formed in 1982/83 and were brilliantly lead by their captain Bryan Dempsey. In the grand final, a record-breaking all grades partnership of 199 by Ben Arnall (139) and Alex Maxwell (120) helped the team score over 300 and bowl Epping out for 260.

Thank you to the management committee for all their hard work this season in ensuring we have the best facilities in Shires.

Also a big thank you to Lane Cove Council – Bryan, Trent and Daniel. It is a pleasure to play cricket at our grounds, which shows not only with Longueville Oval winning Lower Grade Ground of the Year for the first time.

Thank you to the Junior Sub Committee led by Michael Mahoney. I can't begin to tell you how much work goes into our Junior Club, with around 25 teams playing. We have numerous representative players and Emerging Blues players in the junior ranks.

To John Lloyd, thank you for running In2Cricket this season. We had 50 kids involved in the program which has resulted in \$2,500 towards construction of the nets at Longie. To be there for 16 weeks at 8am on a Saturday morning when you have no children involved is testament to your commitment to LCCC. The reports from the parents are always very positive.

The Management Committee has worked hard to ensure that our One-Club Policy has been adhered to and will continue into the future.

We have learnt from our mistakes in the late 90's and the early turn of the century; we need to keep experienced people involved with the Club and we need a home. At the time of writing this report, the four nets have been completed and we must sincerely thank the financial support of Lane Cove Council. The Club will be moving all our training for Seniors and Juniors to Longueville Oval. There is a need to ensure local Juniors come through to the Senior ranks and to have a presence locally were the deciding factors.

The final person I wish to thank is the Secretary: Geof Sundstrom.

As most of you would know, the Secretary is chief executive of the club. Geof has been working 40 hours a week to ensure the whole Club runs smoothly. You would all know this from the personal emails he has sent you about functions. Geof stuck his hand up for manager of the U24's team when it needed to be done, helped with covers and does the website which this season recorded 35,000 hits. I strongly urge future management committees to think of elevating Geof to Life Member status in the near future.

As I have learnt this year, no management committee decisions are always right but if you believe you can assist this great Club put your hand up and make a difference. We can always use more volunteers.

I hope to see you all back in late August for the start of a successful season for the Club.

TREASURER'S REPORT 2011/2012

The 2011/12 season proved to be one of the best in Lane Cove's history for a number of reasons. Exceptional on-field performances across all grades and age groups culminating in two senior grade premierships underpinned the sporting performances. Added to these significant achievements was the commencement of the new cricket net development at Kingsford-Smith Oval and a very healthy financial performance

For the year, the Club returned a net loss of \$20,433 on the back of the investment in our future through the new Kingsford-Smith nets development offset by good fee income, well managed costs and the continued support of our major sponsors Longueville Sporting Club, Holgate Real Estate, Absolute Executive Recruitment and Zoti Sports. Without the generosity of these sponsors, the Club would have to find other ways to raise the necessary funding.

The Committee would also like to thank our other sponsors and supporters that include Proactive Graphics and the Greg Chappell Cricket Centre along with Cricket NSW for their continued support.

For the second year running, a surcharge was implemented on the fees of both junior and senior players in order to fund the upgrade of the 'Longy' nets. We have now finalised our contribution \$40,000 to Lane Cove Council and construction has commenced. We should see the first arm rolled over before the start of the next season.

Fee income was significantly up on last year mainly as a result of having a few more junior teams. It is always pleasing to see newcomers to the sport of cricket and we devote a lot of time and resources to providing exceptional playing conditions for our juniors. As mentioned earlier, the net upgrade surcharge was again in place this season and contributed over \$7,000. Overall income was up by 5% from 2010/11.

Once again our cost management process proved a real winner. The impact of our clothing arrangement with Zoti Sports continued to show benefits as too did better ground utilisation (aided by some credits from council). These items were partially offset by the engagement of an external afternoon tea provider replacing the traditional volunteers. This additional cost to the Club amounted to \$5,500.

Equipment, balls, team registrations and social expenses all rose over prior years. These, in the most part were due to additional junior teams and the social expense line reflects the celebration of Club successes – both particularly pleasing as the Club goes from strength to strength.

Costs to show reductions include coaching, trophies and bank fees. Your committee is working hard to rectify any issues with coaching particularly for the junior teams. Our overall expenses were down by 3%.

As mentioned earlier, the Club continues to improve its' financial position and we are well positioned to continue to provide superior training and playing facilities for the local community. I personally would like to congratulate the 1st and 4th Grade boys on their well-deserved premierships and also the other senior grades on their finals performances.

Once again, as I say every year, the Club cannot survive without the players, partners and parents who assist during each year. I would like to thank age coordinators, captains, players and other Committee members for their assistance in collecting fees and match day payments. My particular thanks to our beloved Secretary Geof Sundstrom for his tireless efforts in ensuring everything was completed.

SENIOR CLUB REPORTS

First Grade Report:

At long, long last!

We did it. We brought home the First Grade premiership and the R.B Clark Trophy to Lane Cove for the first time since 1945/46.

It certainly was a monumental season for the club and one that the history books will say was one of our best ever in our proud 119 year history. This report won't delve too much into individual statistics from the season but instead focus on what we achieved as a team, what winning meant to the team and to everyone who played in the team individually and what it meant to the entire Club.

When I took over the captaincy from Damian Naughton in 2007, First Grade went through a huge period of change. The team itself was basically unrecognisable from the previous season with a mix of new players to the Club and former 2nd and 3rd graders making up the majority of the team. During those first couple of seasons, whilst we certainly enjoyed some great moments and good wins we generally were out-classed by the better teams and our final position on the ladder reflected that.

However, throughout this difficult period we were creating an environment and team culture that people wanted to be a part of and people wanted to play for ... so even though we weren't winning as many games as we would have liked we were recruiting players here and there, players from lower grades were stepping up and developing and we were starting to build a team that had the potential for a top 6 finish. The challenge was to keep the players engaged and enthused about the team while we were going through this re-building phase. I'm confident in saying the environment we did create helped us achieve that pretty well.

In the 2008/09 season we finished in 7th place on 30 points, in 2009/10 we finished in 9th place on 26 points and only a couple of wins out of finals contention. We weren't that far away from cracking it. We had the core of a first grade team in place that had grown as a team over 3 or 4 years and that had all become really good mates. To go to the next level we just needed to fill a couple of gaps.

In 2010/11 we welcomed back Tom Holt and Damian Naughton after 4 year absences from first grade and we also recruited the services of the Gallichan brothers (Richie and Pete) from the Central Coast.

They were the gaps we needed filling, we now had the bunch of blokes we wanted, we now had all the gaps filled, we now had the team that could take us to Premiership glory. That season we had instant success, finishing 3rd on the ladder in the regular season on 70 points, which is the most successful season for first grade in my time at the Club since 1999/2000.

We progressed through to the Semi-Finals after the qualifying final was washed out however Burwood outplayed us in that match and we were knocked out one game short of the big one. Whilst it was devastating at the time to have come so close there was a feeling amongst the team that we belonged in the finals and a commitment was made to each other over numerous end of season drinks that we would all be back to put things right the following season.

Our team in season 2011/12 was basically the same from the previous year. We had unfortunately lost the services of Peter Gallichan to a nasty season-ending injury, but we welcomed new recruit

Michael Forster to the top of the order and the permanent inclusion of John Harpham behind the stumps to give the team the perfect balance that we felt we needed to win the competition.

And we were right! In the season proper we took out the Minor Premiership with 14 wins (2 outright) and 2 first innings losses and finished the season on 69 competition points.

Apart from two forgettable batting performances against Burwood and Auburn we were dominant throughout the season. We were ruthless against the weaker teams and beat the good teams. For me the 2 standout wins from the season proper were our wins against Strathfield by 11 runs and against Lindfield outright after we had lost in the first innings. That win against Lindfield really told me a lot about the team.

Onwards to the finals and we came up against Epping in the Qualifying Finals and gave them a hiding, winning by 7 wickets with Holty doing all the damage with the ball as we rolled them for 67 and then Smith and Forster knocked off the runs without losing a wicket.

So we had reached the semi-finals, again. This time we were ready, however our opponents were the defending Premiers and until this season most certainly had the wood over us in head to head battles.

We batted first at Tantallon Oval in beautiful conditions and we were in trouble early at 2 for 36. We rallied thanks to a nice partnership between Smith and Gayleard who took the score to 100 until we had a dramatic collapse, losing 3 quick wickets leaving us nervously placed at 5 for 121. We got to 8 for 190 with Strathfield on top in perfect conditions for batting. A 9th wicket partnership between the skipper and John Harpham that lasted 132 minutes and produced 63 runs was match-turning and potentially season-saving. Another 28 un-pricable runs was added by John and Peter Mallyon that took us into the 2nd day and more importantly into a winning position.

We finished on 281, we had done our job with the bat and now we needed to do it with the ball and in the field. Wickets fell consistently and apart from a couple of nervous partnerships from the Gorillas it always felt like the game was ours to lose. The bowlers did the job, knocking over the Gorillas for 200 even and in the process propelling us into the Club's first 1st grade grand final in ??? years and for us as a team, our first Grand Final together.

Arch rivals Burwood qualified through in the other semi-final defeating the Auburn Eagles. Beautiful Airey Park will play host to the biggest match for the Club in 66 years.

We won the toss and batted first in excellent conditions for cricket. Burwood's strike bowler Seymour was on song early and had both our openers Smith and Forster back in the sheds with the score at 2 for 31. Jack Gayleard then joined Damian Naughton at the crease and both guys played little blinders. They put on a season record 3rd wicket partnership of 117 and both posted their highest scores of the season.

Damian holed out to mid-off for 66 with the score on 148 and Gayleard for 71 with the score at 4 for 204. We had laid the perfect foundation for a huge score and we needed to capitalise. Enter Richie Gallichan. Richie scored one of the finest centuries for the Club in arguably the Club's biggest ever match. He batted across 2 days and finished with a score of 119 including 18 boundaries. He was well supported by Gerald Cornelius who also produced his best for the GF posting 46, Holty chipped in with 18 and then a second day 10th wicket partnership between Richie and Mallyon of 44 runs capped off our best batting performance in over a decade.

We batted for 117.5 overs scoring (appropriately) 369 runs. Ironically for so many years batting has been our Achilles heel and yet we produced the most marvellous team and individual batting performance I have ever been associated with.

We had all but batted Burwood out of the game, but we wanted to finish the job off, we wanted to take 10 wickets and experience that Premiership winning feeling that had eluded us up until now. We were on top straight away with a sharp run-out by Mick Forster. Pete Mallyon then knocked over the other opening batsman and we were on top at 2 for 19. The next 3 wickets were the big ones. Burwoods's 3 best bats, Squire, Seymour and Holley. If we could get through them, then we knew we were all but home. Squire tickled one behind off the skipper and was well caught by keeper Harpham, Holley skied one to the on-side where Glen Smith moved quicker than he ever has before and took a fantastic catch on the run and Richie Gallichan picked up Seymour with a stunning caught and bowled.

We were now into the tail and victory was in sight. The score was 9 for 180, Peter Mallyon was bowling to Jalalaty, Jalalaty mistimed a lofted drive in the direction of Glen Smith in the covers. Glen wrapped his huge fingers around the Kookaburra and we had done it, we had won the First Grade Sydney Shires Premiership, Lane Cove were the champions.

The on-field embrace and recognition of all your teammates and closest supporters was something we'll never forget. Walking off the field as Premiers for the first time, we just couldn't wait to get into the dressing room and soak it all up.

It wasn't until the following week when I returned to work to find a host of emails from past players with a note of congratulations that I really understood that.

On a personal note I did want to thank Brendan Hood, Geof Sundstrom and the committee for their support this year. Ditto Bryan Dempsey – mate, congratulations, the Club's first ever 4th Grade Premiership, you did a great job, well done. Thanks again to Trent for all his efforts in preparing the home of cricket this year. Thanks to John Lloyd – Porky, we did it mate!

And lastly thanks to all my teammates and mates. I'm extremely proud of what we did this year and I was so proud to be the leader of this team – thanks for the memories and thanks for everything!

Second Grade Report:

The second grade squad this year had a distinctly European feel to it courtesy of new recruits, Martin Tunwell and Pieter Mees, representing England and Dutchland respectively. Not to mention the sprinkling of Italian heritage from the other new club members Ben Chiarella and Joe Scarcella.

To add insult to injury I thought it would be a good idea to raise my hand when the request for volunteers to take on the job of second grade captain was made. What better way really to spend more quality time with Brendan Hood and Alex Dodds? Exactly, a dream job right? So after some reassuring discussions with Lance the deal was made and 2's had a new captain as well!

The season opener against Epping was my first chance to captain a side since I was in high school. (An advantage as most of the squad still behaves like they are 17.) The game started out well enough and before long we had Epping 8 down for 100. At this point I thought this captaining thing was easy. Low and behold before I knew it, Davo was kindly enquiring if I had another new ball as we had reached the 79th over and Epping 191. Our spirits broken in the field our batting never fired and we were comprehensively beaten in the season opener. This could be a long year....

Round 2 versus Pennant Hills saw an improved performance, ensuring our first win of the season. The highlight of the match, Davo and Camarsh (did Gypsy Joe manage to play in every grade this year?) taking 8 wickets between them. Round 3 against Mac Uni gave us our second win, due mainly to a quick fire 50 from the Fish man. Hitting two rather large sixes into the bus shelter on Epping round, and the wickets shared between the bowlers. A special mention needs to go to Michael "Boycott" Doherty, his 19 runs from 92 deliveries in 137 minutes setting the platform for the batsmen.

Two wins from three starts and our season now back on track.

Coming into round 4 our confidence as a team was growing and all the boys were fired up for the annual grudge match of the year versus Strathfield. Well, some of us more than others, as Pieter (BDK) didn't arrive at the match until 12pm, in a state that would make a Russian sailor look sober!

Winning the toss and batting we scraped our way to 182, with the runs shared amongst the batsmen. Even though Strathfield was yet to drop a game for the season we were confident we had enough runs to defend.

What followed in the remaining 20 overs of the day was one of the highlights of the season a bowling master class from A Dodds and Joey, leaving Strathfield at 5/25 overnight.

Returning the following week we held our nerve and snagged the 6 points, taking down the reigning premiers in the process. Special mention to Joey (5/62), Farmer (4/32) and to the great man BDK (6 catches, 1 stumping). It was here that we witnessed the birth of the legend - BDK OOTG. (Not bad for a bloke who was dead set the drunkest man alive!)



We followed this performance up with our fourth win in a row against Roseville, again Joey starring with the ball with figures of 4/16. As skipper I couldn't have asked for much more from the boys, 4 wins from 5 matches and second on the ladder a third of the way through the season.

Our winning streak was abruptly brought to a halt by our sub par performance against Burwood, but to our credit we wasted no time getting back on track with two wins against South Sydney. The first of which was in the one day format on the back of a solid performance from the batsmen (no, true story!) who registered a handy 276 from 50 overs. T Mac, Davo and I making 50's, and Fish unlucky to miss out on 48.

In response to our imposing total South Sydney didn't see anything that Farmer threw at them, with Nathan recording his most economical figures for the year with 5/15. The second win was in the 20/20 format, Farmer again doing the damage with 3/13 from his 4 overs. The only other real highlight of this match was the number 11 for South Sydney coming to the crease with no pads on!

The following 3 rounds saw us extend our winning streak to five matches, beating Georges River (in a spiteful affair) thanks to Davo (47 not out from a total 123), Bezer and Joey (4 wickets each), NWS (A Dodds 3/16), and an outright win against Lindfield. The match being memorable not only due to the outright win but having the pleasure of watching John Lloyd take two screaming catches and Doherty doing a runner when the score books weren't adding up correctly post match.

A close loss to Southern Districts then ended our second winning streak and a wash out against the eventual premiers Warringah robbed us of another certain win. A match we should have never been in a position to win after being 8/78. Joey had other ideas that day however, and in what was to be the best individual batting performance of the year he went on to make a 100 runs from 81 balls, with 7 fours and 5 sixes!. In turn, scoring a record partnership 95 with Farmer for the 10th wicket, getting the team to 221 in the process. Joey wasn't finished yet though, taking the new ball and bagging 2 wickets leaving Warringah reeling at 4/20 overnight. Unfortunately rain ruled out a result the following week and robbed Joey of man of the match.

Even before the final round of the regular season we had done enough to lock up second position on the ladder, a great result. Duckman clearly knowing this decided he shouldn't waste a perfectly good Friday night, the aftermath below.



Despite this, the last round was still interesting for a number of teams, with up to 4 different possible opposition sides vying for the last spot in the 6, Auburn being one of them. With a win against us, Auburn did secure 5th position and the honour of playing us again in the qualifying final the week after.

Unfortunately the next week we were greeted to a wet wicket and a soaked outfield ensuring no play was possible on the Saturday. The Sunday was not shaping up much better with the wicket still wet and the outfield carrying water from further overnight rain.



Some how, and credit must go to the Auburn boys efforts, we managed to get a reduced 60 over match started late on Sunday. To say winning the toss was now critically important would be an understatement! The skipper let the side down and we were sent in to bat on a rough old track. What followed was our worst batting display of the year, all out for 52. Still, given our hard work throughout the year (finishing second) and other QF results going our way we marched on to the semi final!

Strathfield was probably just as surprised as we were to meet them in the semi and not the final. Irrespective, we knew we would have to beat them again at some stage in the season to have any chance of taking the title.

Winning the toss and batting first we rectified our batting problems from the week before reaching 100 for the loss of 4 wickets; steady enough given the finals pressure with neither side taking the ascendancy at this early point. Enter our standard middle order collapse however and Strathfield were on top, 7 wickets down for 131.

This brought BDK to the wicket with Doddsy who had their work cut out for them given the verbal barrage of compliments they were getting from our opposition. The boys didn't give in though, with BDK absorbing the pressure at one end while Dodds got on with the scoring. The partnership netting 33 valuable runs and pushing our total to 189 all out and the match again evenly poised thanks to the tail wagging.

We knew we had to start strong with the ball and take our chances given our modest total. Joey and Dodds had the job of getting early wickets while keeping it tight. Even with some excellent bowling

Strathfield snuck out to 30 without loss before Alex broke the opening partnership. A double bowling change saw Farmer remove the other opener and the number 4 with Cox removing Sylvester. A brilliant spell from Farmer followed supported strongly by Joey (It felt like McGrath and Warne were bowling) getting us back in the match with Strathfield now 7 wickets down for 133 and shortly to be 8 for 135 before we unfortunately ran out of overs and time on the first day.

We had done enough to stay in the game and early on the second day thought we had a better than even chance of winning first innings. The Strathfield tail dug in however and crept their way up to 186 before we finally made the breakthrough. The equation now 3 runs, 1 wicket. Unfortunately we didn't take the chances we created and Strathfield took the points first innings, all out for 204.

Not giving up we had enough time to push for an outright result with some quick runs. Fish took up this challenge and set about giving a batting master class dispatching two large sixes into the creek on his way to 60 from 41 deliveries. Our middle order pitched in for quick runs with Dodds also chipping in at the end with 26 to add to his 30 not out in the first innings. The equation now 45 overs to take 10 wickets with 160 runs to defend.

This is where our lack of match play over the last month came back to hurt us with the bowlers struggling to get much out of the flat and even slower wicket and having to back up from a tough day the day before. Strathfield also showed their experience in finals matches being overly cautious and patient to creep over the line 5 wickets down with a few overs in hand taking the outright win. Alex the pick of the bowlers with 2 wickets for 24 runs.

They say you take more out of a loss than you do a win sometimes and this match was one of those. We dug in over the two days and kept fighting back each time the opposition put us on the ropes, showing plenty of heart and belief. As skipper, even though we didn't win, I was immensely proud of the way we went about it as a team. Special mention to Dodds (sorry boys, I couldn't avoid it) for his 56 runs and 3 wickets keeping us in the match and also Farmer for his 6 for 74 nearly stealing the first innings win for us. Not to mention Joey, Fish and Cotty for their efforts with the bat, ball and catching throughout the match.

I genuinely believe that 2011-2012 was a real turning point for Lane Cove Second Grade. It has been a side that has historically underperformed, relying on a late flurry of wins to fall into the 6 and hope things fall in our favour. In my opinion, we really turned a corner in terms of our approach week in week out. We developed a belief and confidence within the 11 blokes, that we were the more talented side and physically and mentally tougher than the 11 blokes that trotted out every week. I couldn't help but be impressed with the intent and hostility in the field, and the effort by the boys to never give up that got us over the line on so many occasions. In previous years we may have folded in the face of positive cricket and verbal "pressure", but this year I think it brought out the best in us.

Cricket is, as we all know, is an incredibly simple game. At the end of the day you don't necessarily look at the wins and losses (well you do), or the batting and bowling averages. It's the little things that let you know that you are playing with 11 blokes that want to put in. The extra overs that Doherty plays and misses that then makes it easier for the tail..... the catch fish holds onto at mid on..... the gut busting chase from Daly to save a run..... the extra 2 overs Joey bowls when he's cooked.....the time spent in selections and on phone calls and emails...

That's why you play the game. Well that, and a semi legitimate excuse to get on the cans and disgrace yourself on a Saturday night.

The future of this side looks strong. With strong contributions from prodigies Daly, Cox and Scarcella and experienced boos like Fish, Dodds Davo and even myself the large skipper the team is in a good position to right the wrongs of this season next year.

In summary a strong season performance culminating with second grade representing one of the four teams that Lane Cove cricket club had in the semi finals. All the boys are no doubt fired up to go one better for next year.

Third Grade Report:

Many thanks to our sponsors whose support has lifted the Club to these great heights. I hope we can continue to build on the relationships we've maintained in coming seasons. Thanks also to Hoody and the committee for the work done during the year to keep things ticking over, and to the tiring few who continue to plug away behind the scenes to ensure what needs to be done is done.

In summary, the season was a chore, a hardship, emotionally and mentally draining, and I'm going to enjoy not doing anything in future years. I hated the jobs I was doing and most of the people I was doing them for. I look forward to seeing less of you, and some of you not at all. Enjoy the successes and celebrate long into the night while you can because next season we'll be terrible again. Roseville, Roseville.

Fourth Grade Report:

The season started with high hopes of making the top 4 - a position we felt was necessary to potentially win a Premiership. Many familiar faces were up for a game again with a few new guys to balance out the sides, overall we had strengthened ourselves throughout the grades it seemed. With pre-season training for the keen ones and the practice match out of the way, the season was on. Turns out we couldn't have scripted it better if we had tried.

Our first game was against Epping who we towed up outright very easily after making 4/238 Dec. My side included Fish, Doddsy, Paddy, Knappy, Marty Tzikas and Hoody who all contributed to the big win. Round 2 we posted 4/253 off our 50 overs to beat Pennant Hills by 80 odd runs with Paul Ritchie a great 100* and 4/39, Shane Willoughby 38* with Jarrod Rixon 69. Round 3 Mac Uni beat us with Mick Dwyer the main contributor with 5 wickets. Round 4 Strathfield smashed us outright with Ben Chiarella 29 and 5 for 56 one of the only few to put up a real fight. Round 5 we are back on the winners list against Roseville with Dunny back to roll out his leggies 3/31 the main destroyer. Before I go any further and bore you all with a game by game for the rest of the season, I want to make my point. You would think after reading the names mentioned that this side had the makings of a genuine Premiership claim. Out of all the names mentioned in the first 5 rounds that contributed the most Fish, Doddsy, Knappy, Tzikas, Hood Ritchie, Willoughby, Rixon, Dwyer, Chiarella and Dunn – not one of them played in our finals campaign. Whilst I acknowledge that 4th Grade goes through many players through the season and I thank each and every one for their contribution, it showed me how much our eventual team really stepped up to the mark.

From Round 6 to the last game, we won the easy games and lost or threw away the rest to finish the year in 6th position. The last game of the year saw us chasing 250 in a one dayer against Auburn and making the runs with 8 overs to spare, giving us some confidence leading into the finals. During this period of the season many phone calls to recruit and qualify a team were made so we could firstly make finals and then be competitive. It is here where I thank the selectors for their understanding as we all were going through similar journeys trying to juggle teams and qualifications. Names like Wing, Sargeant, Aman, Arnall, Maxwell, Delaney and Southcott started to become regulars in 4th Grade along with Scott, Schaafsma and French. Bring on the finals and let's see if this team can show its potential.

By finishing 6th we had the hard task of playing Strathfield – who smashed us outright earlier –with wet weather forecast for the lead up to and most of the weekend. The possibility of getting bundled out of finals again like last year without a ball being bowled was a real possibility. First day called off at 9.30am, ground closed with huge puddles everywhere, more rain forecast, pitch very damp and the Strathfield boys saying from experience that it won't dry until mid week at best. As a team we talked about our options: 1/ walk away, get bundled out of the finals, talk about what could have been (Scotty, Frenchy and myself did this last season), or: 2/ come back at 12 noon with every bin, bucket or tupperware container we could find to move as much water as we could for the rest of the day. As a team we moved water for 6 hours; I couldn't have been prouder of my team and the way the boys stuck at it.

The plan was to turn up at 8am and start bailing water all over again and see where we end up. To my delight, the groundsman was rolling the wicket, there was still many puddles but not as big as the day before. No one had to be told what to do after 6 hours of shifting water we had our technique pretty much perfect. The Strathfield boys looked very nervous at the prospect of playing on a damp pitch against a team showing some real determination to get a game underway. The umpires were also impressed at our efforts and at 10am we had a meeting where we were asked if

we could be warmed up and ready in 20 minutes to start. We could have been ready in 10min after the effort we had put in. We had to win the game so when I won the toss there was no hesitation to send them in on a pitch that would be difficult to bat on if we bowled good areas. We were pumped and the Strathfield boys a little shell-shocked; they had planned to sail through to the next round on a washout.

Jackson picked up two early wickets before Scotty and Crazy Joe settled in to bowl unchanged for 40 overs. Joe picked up 6 for 39 off 23 overs to destroy the Strathfield batting in a spell that, looking back, set the scene for the finals. To bowl that well with a broken thumb was a great effort from a guy that added plenty to our team; he quickly made 4th Grade his home and to his credit gave it everything to get us over the line. His support at the other end was mister reliable Scotty, whilst not getting the rewards, his spell of 20 overs 1 for 29 was equally important. After bowling Strathfield out for 87 it was game on - every run would be earnt as their bowling had been their strength all year. We quickly got ourselves into trouble at 5 for 24 with Ben Arnall fighting hard. Maxy and Ben got us to 6 for 41, not even half way. Ben and Crazy took us to 7 for 55 before Crazy was gone with Daz soon after 8 for 55 and in all sorts. Ben was joined by Jacko to put together an unbroken partnership of 36 to see us through to the next final in an absolute heart stopper. Ben 42not to push Crazy for man of the match status and Jacko the best 12 not out you would want to see from a number 10. Bring on Mac Uni the effort - shifting so much water was worth it!

Neither Scotty or I had beaten Mac Uni in 4th Grade so this would take a mighty effort. We lost Maxy up to 2's and picked up Lloyd to keep and lost Daz to work to be capably replaced by Cam Bezer. Fine weather and a good pitch greeted us at Mac Uni's No 1 ground. Won the toss and sent them in trying to exploit any early movement. Beez a wicket in his first over, Jacko one soon after saw us get off to a good start. Wickets tumbled at regular intervals throughout their innings to have them bowled out for 94 off 47 overs. All bowlers stuck to the task, backed up by good fielding. Beez 4 for 14 off 11 was the pick of the bowlers with one wicket each to Jacko, Rafe and Scotty with Crazy getting 2 poles. We can stuff up a small run chase as seen the previous week so we knew that we had to knuckle down. At 4 for 22 it was looking like a replay of the week before with Wingy being the rock. Wingy and I got us to 45 before I was on my way, quickly followed by Frenchy, Crazy and last week's hero Jacko, 8 for 69. We had managed to get ourselves into another hole with Wingy fighting to keep us in the game. He was joined by Beez who stuck around long enough to put on 23 with Wingy. At 9 for 92 and still 3 runs to win, hearts were racing for the second week. Scotty joined Wingy who took a single to give Scotty the strike, next ball a leg glance for 2 runs and we passed them to secure first innings points... 2 balls later Scotty is dismissed. Wingy ended up 37 not out - to bat that well under pressure was a mighty effort. A slender 1 run lead that will do for now but still 150 overs to play, so that lead whilst vital will count for nothing unless we can knuckle down for the rest of the game.

Mac Uni had to set us a total and give themselves enough time to bowl us out with 17 overs to play on day 1. As expected, they came out swinging, lost 2 quick wickets then realized that this approach wasn't going to work so they dug in to be 3 for 41 at the end of day one. We couldn't celebrate our 1 run first innings victory as so many overs were left to get a second innings result, turn up and play good cricket for another day was the only option to secure that Grand Final spot.

Day 2 saw Mac Uni take the honours with the bat. Our bowling wasn't as sharp; that wasn't helped by the walking wounded in the field. Mac Uni took their score to 9 for 195 dec. Wickets went to Bezer, Jacko and Scotty 3 each. This left us 74 overs to get the runs or bat out the day. We aimed to play positive cricket on a good wicket and get the runs with batting the day out our fall back plan. At 2 for 0 and 3 for 13, the fall back plan was initiated early. Wingy who was seeing them like basket balls and Rafe set about digging us out of trouble. What was to follow were two of the best

defensive innings you would want to see from two guys whose naturally aggressive approach simmered under the surface. A job had to be done, the fight and belief in the two guys was a credit to them and showed the will to win that this side had developed over the last couple of weeks. The partnership ate up 40 overs until Wingy was dismissed for 65 off 133 balls with the score a more respectable 4 for 110 with just 14 overs to play. Rafe was out soon after for 34 off an impressive 180 balls. Crazy 20 not with a few lusty hits saw us last our 74 overs to finish on 6 for 142 and Grand Final bound.

Masters Report – Blue:

The 2011/12 Season was a successful season that was satisfactory from a results perspective but spectacular from a team building perspective. Lane Cove Blue finished in eighth place out of 20 with 5 wins, 5 losses and two draws (washouts). In all matches played we were competitive and with an ounce of luck we could have won all of them. We now have a very solid team capable of placing at the top of the competition next season.

Round 1 against Warringah was washed out. An inauspicious start to the season.

In our first competitive fixture we started with a great win against NWSH Cyclones at Tantallon Oval. It is always a pleasure to play at Tantallon and we usually lift when we play there. Batting first we made a respectable 6/116 with a top score of 33 from Anthony Gill at the top of the order. We then skittled Cyclones for 49 with John Short taking 4 wickets for 2 runs and Ron Corby taking 3 wickets for 3 runs.

Our next match against Parramatta Golden Oldies was one of the matches that got away. Again batting first we made 187. Again, Anthony Gill made 33 at the top of the order and John Short made an excellent 42 not out. However, it was an opportunity to score over 200 and we were bowled out with 5 balls left in the innings. We bowled very well and held the run rate down early on with Greg Gard bowling 7 overs 1 for 23 runs and Mark Butler 7 overs 1 for 18 runs. In the end our fielding and our concentration let us down and Parramatta won the match with one ball to spare.

Our 3rd match was against the eventual champions, Mosman, at Kingsford Smith Oval. For the third time in a row we were able to bat first. Again, we made a very promising start however we bowled out for 127 after 37.3 overs. Rain, interrupted the match and Mosman's target was reduced to 102 off 32 overs. Again, we bowled superbly, and had Mosman in trouble throughout their innings. In the end they finished 8/104 off 24.1 overs.

Greg Gard taking 4 for 39 off 9 overs, John Short 2 for 32 off 9 overs and Mark Butler 2 for 11 off 3 overs. We felt the weather gods had robbed us of a win in this match.

The next round was against the Sri Lanka Lion at Harold Reid Park, an astroturf pitch. Bowling first in hot weather we were exceptional restricting the Lions to 9/128 off 40 overs. All of the bowlers were magnificent with John Short (9-2-3-22), Greg Gard (9-4-1-12) and Mark Butler (8-4-0-9) being the pick. Rain began falling during the second innings which made batting difficult and we never got in front of the run rate and were bowled out for 106 with Stuart Gard top scoring with 29. We felt the weather gods had again intervened and affected the result.

Round 6 was notable for the first competitive match of Kim Butler (yes the competition is unisex). Bowling first we had restricted NWSH Hurricanes to 8/142 after 37 overs when rain brought a close to their innings. Mark Butler finishing with 3 for 18 off 6 overs. The run chase started in a familiar way with Daryl Webb out early lbw. We then consolidated with a solid second wicket stand between Warrick Gard (28) and Al Beattie (21). Mark Butler made a respectable 25 with Kim Butler the next highest score with 6 not out. We were bowled out for 116 in 35 overs. 3 matches in a row affected by rain and 3 losses.

Round 7 marked the match of the season. The annual challenge for the Bob Radford Shield. Lane Cove Blue v Lane Cove White. A match where more is on the line than just points. Winning the toss we had no hesitation in batting first and we were off to a flyer. Greg Gard made a quick fire 36 and Anthony Gill supported him with a well made 31. Daryl Webb fell victim to lbw again and Warrick Gard played a lazy shot to be out for 1 from the wily Glen Spratt. The innings was rescued

by great innings from Mark Butler (41), John Short (42 no) and Jamie Cooper (36). We were all out on the last ball for 231. A fine score at Kingsford Smith. The Whites put up a good effort with the bat but in the end fine bowling from our openers Ron Corby (7-1-3-32) and Greg Gard (8-1-3-34) and a great finishing spell from Chandra Gunarathne (6.1-0-3-29) was enough to stop the Whites at 195. For the first time in 6 years the Bob Radford Shield had been defended by the holders.

Round 8 against Doyalson was washed out.

Round 9 was against Epping at Tantallon. Epping won the toss and inserted us on a damp pitch that was very nasty for the first hour or so. After losing Anthony Gill early we knuckled down and scored 151 runs all out on the last ball. This was a great effort with key contributions from Warrick Gard (28), Daryl Webb (30 - and not out lbw) and Mark Butler (27). We began our bowling with great pace and venom and had Epping at 5/45. It looked good at this point until our captain recalled their next wicket to fall due to his insistence that he had not edged the ball. In hindsight this turned out to be the turning point as the batsman went on to top score with 36 and Epping won the game with an over to spare. Despite the loss our bowlers were again fantastic with Greg Gard (8.5-2-2-22), John Short (9-2-3-36) and Jamie Cooper (8-1-2-21 plus a player foolishly called back) standing out.

Round 10 brought us back to Kingsford Smith against Lindfield Legends. Another toss won and another automatic choice to bat first. We then put in our best effort of the season reaching 4/229 off our forty overs. John Short (40 no), Al Beattie (43 no) and Tom Eade (42 no) were well supported by Ken Fletcher (36) and Warrick Gard (28). Rain during the interval shortened Lindfield's innings to 20 overs. This assisted Lindfield as their target was halved but they they still were able to utilise 10 wickets. They however finished at 3/54 with one retired hurt after a fine opening spell from John Short (5-3-3-2) broke their spirit.

We were now on a roll and entered round 11 versus Burwood Briars with a lot of confidence. Our captain was late to this match after being summoned to an art auction by his wife so Greg Gard won the toss, elected to bat and elected to instal himself as opener. This paid dividends and he started the innings with a spritely 29. While no player managed to reach 40 significant contributions were made by John Short (37), Martin Potts (25) and Warrick Gard (28 no). This left us with 8/164 after 40 overs. A good score on a large oval but still with a lot to do. Again our bowlers did not let us down and for once we all fielded magnificently. The pick of the bowlers were David Mowatt (7-0-4-15), John Short (8.4-2-2-21) and Greg Gard (9-1-2-37). Martyn Potts (6-0-0-19) bowled extremely well at the death and we held on to get Burwood all out for 161 runs with 2 balls remaining in the innings.

Round 12 provided the strangest match I have watched for a long time. It was against NWSH Storm at Kingsford Smith Oval. The Storm arrived with 7 players and were keen for a game. We won the toss and elected to bat. As a sporting gesture we provided Storm with 2 fieldsmen throughout our innings. After his success the previous match Greg Gard decided to open the innings and again was superb with 27 before turned a slow full toss into a chest high delivery and he was bowled in only the 5 over. From there it all went wrong and we were dismissed for 82 runs in 21.2 overs. Woeful. The Storm innings was equally amazing. Their opener and top scorer achieved 35 runs however they were bowled out for 67 runs in 14.1 overs largely thanks to John Short (7-2-3-17).

The final match of the season was a T20 at Kingsford Smith against Warringah. We have not really got the hang of this format and again this year we underperformed. Warringah won the toss and compiled a very good 7/141. John Short (4-0-3-11) was again brilliant with the ball but the rest of the bowlers struggled to contain Warringah. Our batting produced a commendable 119 all out off 19 overs and Mark Butler (23 no), Martyn Potts (22), Ken Fletcher (18) and Simon Perry (18) all providing something to cheer about.

With the season over we enjoyed an ale or two at the Diddy and began plotting our strategy for next season.

While all players contributed the season was marked by a stunning individual performance from John Short. As a result John was selected by opposition captains as the Player of the Year (based on a 3-2-1 vote cast after each match). Notable season performances included:

Lane Cove Smith was substantially a continuation of the U10 Smith team from 2010/11. We lost three players Xavier O'Grady and Pierce Roseby who left to pursue other activities and Cameron Pascoe who went up to the U12s. The new additions were Adam McLean and Isaac Saunders both of whom made strong contributions to the team over the course of the season. Once again the team consisted of a number of underage but promising cricketers. Two of those boys went on to represent the North Shore at U10 level, Mitchell Crayn and Adam Sidhu and Mitchell finished the season winning the Neil McIlwraith Trophy for Outstanding Colts Player.

The season began with an outstanding win over St Ives Watson at Regimental Reserve. Lane Cove scored a massive 4/292 off 30 overs with 6 players hitting 25 n.o. or more and then bowled St Ives out for 62 in 19 overs. Will Tobin's 3 wickets for 6 runs were a highlight. Another fine batting effort followed in our second game against West Pymble Blue with Lane Cove scoring 3/192 off 30 overs with guest player Alex Sidhu 30 no (at No 11), Sean O'Farrell a fine 28 and Nick Radford a swashbuckling 24 (with 5 4s). West Pymble were held to 7/113. Our third game saw Lane Cove Smith dominate comprehensively with the ball dismissing St Ives Haddin for 39 runs in 12 overs! Carson Forrest's 2/2, Lachlan's 3/3 and Mitchell's 2/7 and 2 run outs were outstanding. Our openers Adam Sidhu and Nick Loane scored the runs in 7 overs without loss.

Our 4th match was a tense struggle against a very good North Sydney Gold team at Chatswood High. Lane Cove batted first and fine innings by Sean O'Farrell 32no, Mitchell Crayn 25no and Lachlan Phillips 23 set the team up for a good score. A fine hat-trick by North Sydney put the brakes on in the middle order before a great 29no by Adam McLean helped us to 9/208 – the third time that we'd batted first and scored over 200! Some very tight bowling restricted North Sydney to 7/152 and Isaac Saunders took 2/8 with 2 wickets in 2 balls devastating their top order.

The next match was a very tough affair at Pottery Green against St Ives Johnson. St Ives Johnson batted first and scored 4/97 which would have been 130 to 140 on any other ground. A modest batting performance had

us facing down the barrel at 7/75 with 3 overs to go. Secret weapon Alex Sidhu came in at No 11 and top scored with 17 runs off about 9 balls to steer us home in a real jail escape. Our next game against Mosman at Balmoral saw us return to form bowling Mosman out for 48 runs in 23 overs with outstanding bowling by all the bowlers. Mitchell Crayn 26no and Will Tobin 20no knocked off the runs in just 6 overs.

Our round 7 game against Lindfield Johnson at Pottery Green saw us have a comfortable win scoring 7/152 (Mitchell scoring a fine 27 n.o. supported by Carson Forrest's 21) and then holding St Ives to 7/89. Tight bowling was starting to become a real feature of our team's performance.

Our next game against Lindfield Hussey saw us put together our best start in a game for the season losing our first wicket at 161 in the 24th over. We finished with 4/185 with a fine 27no from Will Tobin, 23no from Lachlan and 20no from Nick Radford the highlights. Lindfield Hussey were held to just 6/91.

8 wins from 8 matches! Disappointingly the top of the table clash against West Pymble Red was washed out – we would just have to wait. The following week saw us lose our first match for the season. Lindfield Clarke posted a very modest 109 but with only Mitchell Crayn 24, showing any real resistance with the bat we were bowled out for 94.

Our final game before the Xmas break saw us post a modest 101 at Pottery Green against West Pymble Gold. Again very tight bowling especially by Will with 2/3 saw us dismiss them for 72.

At the break we had 9 wins, 1 loss and a washout, exactly the same as our rivals West Pymble Red although we shaded them on percentages. A very strong performance.

Round 12 resumed in late January with Lane Cove taking on Gordon Red in the wet long grass at Artarmon Reserve. We batted first and scored 2/121 – with Sean O'Farrell 15 n.o., Nick Loane 15 n.o. and Mitchell Crayn 14 n.o. all scoring runs. We then bowled Gordon out for 20 in 18 overs in what was our finest bowling performance of the season. Will Tobin's 2/0 and Nick Loane's 2/1 were highlights. The next round was disappointingly another washout.

That left us going into the rescheduled 14th round against fellow top of the table team West Pymble Red having had only one game of cricket in nine weeks.

In the end it didn't matter. Lane Cove batted first at Lofberg and was bowled out for only the second time in the season scoring 118. Mitchell Crayn's brilliant 32no and Lachlan Phillips 22 were the men that really stepped up with the bat. We then bowled to a team that at that point had three batsmen that had scored 200 runs or more. But bowling was our strength and we bowled them out for 47 in just 17 overs. Two demolition bowling performances in consecutive weeks. Will Tobin's 2/3 and Nick Loane's 2/4 were key.

Our final two competition rounds were against St Ives Watson and North Sydney Red, both teams that were well down the ladder. Against St Ives we scored 6/160 before bowling them out for 28 in 11 overs. Adam McLean's 24 as an opener and Michael O'Farrell's 14 singles laid the foundation with the bat before Michael destroyed them with the ball taking 3/5 off 2 overs, ably supported by Lachlan Phillips who took 2/0. Our last game against North Sydney Red was won on a forfeit.

At the end of 16 rounds we had finished first and won 13, lost 1 and had 2 washouts. We went into the semi-finals with some confidence where we were scheduled to play West Pymble Red again. However for the second time against West Pymble and the third time in the season the game was washed out and we went through to the Grand Final as the highest ranked team.

The Grand Final was played against St Ives Johnson at Pottery Green. Lane Cove won the toss and batted first and scored a tight 9/110, not as much as the coaches would have liked but a respectable total on this ground. Again Mitchell Crayn's 25 n.o. proved invaluable as were solid contributions from Adam Sidhu with 15, Nick Radford with 13 and Lachlan Phillips also with 13.

The game was there to be won. Lane Cove put in a brilliant performance in the field and bowled St Ives out for 59 off 25.5 overs. With half the overs gone St Ives had lost only 2 wickets but had scored just 35 runs, again reflecting the tightness of the bowling. The key wicket of Thomas Elliot who was caught by Adam McLean off the bowling of Sean O'Farrell for just 11 was the turning point. Adam Sidhu's 2/3 off 3 overs and a catch and Nick Radford's 2/1 brought the game home. Isaac Saunders won it with a great final spell of 2/3 including 2 wickets in 2 balls.

They had climbed the mountain....the boys were very happy the coaching staff and parents relieved that the promise had been delivered on. The real highlights were the outstanding contributions throughout the season by all the boys and the spirit with which they played the game. The memories of 2010/11 had been erased.

Oh no! Another season of dominance rewarded with the minor premiership but once again, despite our very best efforts, we fell short at the final hurdle losing with one over remaining to a North Sydney side who saved one of their best displays for the final. Our boys played some fantastic cricket during the season including a comprehensive win over the aforementioned North Sydney team. Anyway you look at it we had a remarkable season, we scored more than 2000 runs (500 more than our nearest opposition) and took more 125 wickets. Great joy was taken by all to see the boys improve in all areas of batting, bowling and fielding, especially those key areas that delight the purists such as running between wickets, backing up, walking in with the bowler, getting bodies behind balls and not giving up extras etc.

Our Batting Award again went to Max Rogers who scored 302 runs at an average of 100.67 in only 12 innings, he hit 35 fours, reached 30 seven times, was dismissed only 3 times and had a highest score of 36 not out. Rarely did Max fail and his ball striking, array of shots and running between wickets were a feature. Other notable performers with the bat were Cameron Pascoe (246 @ 49.20, HS 30*) a massive improvement on last season, and Nick Hill (216 @ 30.86, HS 41*). Steve Matheson, Richard Rutherford and Andrew Harrison all scored more than 100 runs. Most pleasing was that all contributed well at the wicket throughout the season. We had several matches where we scored more than 200 runs from our 32 overs.

Our Bowling Award went to Andy Harrison whose swing bowling took 18 wickets @ 5.56 with a best bowling of 5/7. Andy bowled consistently well all season and saw the benefits of bowling a

full length at the stumps. Other notable contributors with the ball were Thomas Pitts (14 wickets @ 6.79, BB 4/13) and Sean Glover (10 wickets @8.60), others like Cameron Pascoe, Nick Hill, Flynn Mahoney and Max Rogers bowled consistently well without getting the wickets. Hamish Sullivan improved out of sight, greatly increasing his accuracy and taking some valuable wickets. Steve Matheson took 7 wickets with his dart-like offies despite only playing the first part of the season. On several occasions we were able to bowl sides out for less than 50 runs.

Our Fielding Award again went to Nick Hill who took 9 catches. Nick has a great pair of hands and a strong arm. Andy Harrison also had a great year in the field with 8 catches and 3 run outs while others like Richard Rutherford, Sean Glover, Ben Warburton and Cameron Pascoe had safe and prolific pairs of hands. Our keeping duties were shared between Steve Matheson, Ollie Wheeler and Emlyn Evans, all were very good behind the stumps. That said, our fielding is the one area where we could really improve, we took most of our catches this year but missed many run out opportunities, something to work on.

Our Most Improved Award was a difficult one with lots of strong candidates, Hamish Sullivan, Richard Rutherford, Sean Glover and Cameron Pascoe (batting) all had strong claims, but in the end it was Emlyn Evans whose bowling and keeping improved significantly through out the year. Our Spirit of Cricket Award was also a tough one, with Ollie Wheeler, Emlyn Evans and Ben Warburton all good candidates for their fantastic attitudes, in the end we gave the Award to Thomas Pitts whose spirit and effort were consistently strong throughout the season, a pleasure to coach.

Many thanks to Malcolm Pascoe for taking on the difficult role of co-coaching with me! Rob Rutherford for managing, and Mike Wheeler, Peter Hill for shouldering the bulk of the umpiring. Heartfelt thanks once again to our scorer extraordinaire, Scott Glover, who performed this specialised task with aplomb. Special thanks to all the parents for their help and support and for making this another very enjoyable year. I guess there is always next year...

Lane Cove Thommo was an amalgamation of players from the U13 Lane Cove Thommo and U12 Lane Cove Bradman teams from 2011. With the Thommo players having made the Grand Final in U13s in 2011 the expectations were set from the outset that this was a team that would do well although with a number of new players this was far from certain. With the need for a number of boys to juggle school cricket commitments the team played with an extended roster of 18 players. The core of the team was Patrick O'Farrell (Capt), Conor Fahey, Harry Quirk, Charlie Hoffman, Alex Sidhu, Flynn Mahoney, James Veitch, Oliver Morris, Will Bremner, Liam Zucconi, Luka Flanagan, Ethan Price and Aled Morris. Special thanks go to Sean O'Farrell who backed up from U11 Smith to play 4 matches and super sub Adam Sidhu who filled in on a number of occasions. The team played in the very competitive U13 PM division with 12 teams in the competition.

The season began with a tough first up game against our club mates, Lane Cove Ponting at Wellington Oval in Lindfield. Lane Cove Thommo batted first and scored 7/145 with James Veitch (38 no) and Alex Sidhu (35 no) the pick of the batsmen, supported by Ollie Morris with 22. In reply, Thommo bowled out the Ponting team for 135 in the 32nd over with Will Bremner's 3/8 and Alex Sidhu's 3/12 doing the damage. Tight bowling was to be a feature of Thommo's performance throughout the season. Second game saw us take on St Pius White on a very heavy Artarmon Reserve. We won the toss and batted first and despite the loss of an early wicket for 8 the next 4 batsmen were all retired. We finished with 3 /149 which was a very competitive total with Harry

Quirk (31 no), Ollie Clarke (27) and Patrick O'Farrell (21) the pick. In reply, St Pius scored 9/96 off their 32 overs with the wickets shared.

Round 3 was against St Ives Ponting at Forrestville. St Ives won the toss and put Lane Cove in to bat. The openers Veitch (38) and Sidhu got the team off to a solid start with the first wicket falling at 49. Solid contributions from Luka Flanagan (27 no) and Will Bremner (22) saw the team bowled out in the 32nd over for 172. Some fiery bowling by Charlie Hoffman saw both openers removed within the space of the first 3 overs. With Flynn Mahoney bowling line and length at the other end the runs quickly dried up and at the halfway mark St Ives were 3 for 52 requiring 121 off the next 16 overs. The task was too great and Lane Cove Thommo held them to just 129/9. Charlie Hoffman's 2/9 off 5 overs was the pick of the bowling.

Round 4 saw us up against the unbeaten St Ives Warne at Gladesville Reserve, a new ground for us. Thommo put on one of their finest performances with the bat scoring 187 for the loss of just 2 wickets the first wicket at 85 and the next for 184. Harry Quirk hit 36 no, Alex Sidhu 35 no, James Veitch 30, and Will Bremner a quickfire 29. In the field the bowling was again tight and at the halfway mark St Ives had scored only 67 for the loss of 2 wickets requiring 120 in the next 16 overs. The challenge was again too great with St Ives Warne being bowled out for 137 in the 32nd over. The pick of the bowling was James Veitch's 4 /8 off 3 overs including a hat-trick. The hat-trick was recorded by way of a catch by Alex Sidhu, a catch by Will Bremner and finished off in magnificent fashion with a stumping by Patrick O'Farrell (who recorded 3 stumpings for the match).

In Round 5 Lane Cove Thommo returned to the sandy shores of Gladesville Reserve to take on Gordon Red. Lane Cove won the toss and batted scoring 8 / 142. Thommo was under some pressure in the first 16 overs having lost 5 wickets and scored only 53 runs. A great middle order partnership between Conor Fahey 36 no and Will Bremner 23 righted the ship and enabled Alex Sidhu and Liam Zucconi to score quickly at No's 9 and 10 and the team to post a respectable total. In reply, in possibly our finest performance in the field, we bowled Gordon Red out for 45 in 20 overs. Charlie Hoffman's opening spell was ferocious and he finished with 4/6 off 4 overs. Again Flynn let them have nothing and finished with 1 /11 off 4. Patrick's 3 catches at keeper, 2 off Charlie's fine bowling were just reward.

The next match was the clash of the two unbeaten teams, Lane Cove Thommo and Ryde Hunters Hill Pirates. Ryde Hunters Hill won the toss and put Lane Cove Thommo in to bat. Again a strong opening partnership of 51 between James Veitch (27) and Alex Sidhu (35no) set the team up well. Strong innings by Harry Quirk 27 and Ollie Morris 38no in the middle order covered some loose batting by the tail and enabled us to post a score of 8/191, our highest of the season to date. Some early quick wickets by Flynn 2/14 and Charlie 1/10 put our opponents under pressure and left them chasing 142 runs off the final 16 overs with only 4 wickets in hand. In the end we held them to 9/123 and won comfortably with Harry's 3/5 off 3 and James' 2/7 off 4 highlights.

Round 7 had us up against Lindfield Miller at Weil Park. Lane Cove won the toss and batted first with James Veitch 37 no and guest opener Ryan McElduff 24 scoring freely. Liam Zucconi batting at No 3 hit a fine 35no. The rest of the order made modest contributions with only Ollie and Patrick getting to double figures. Again a strong start in the field held Lindfield in check and enabled us to finish at 8/125 with the only disappointment our inability to take the remaining wickets, having had them at 5/52 after 16.

Our next match saw us playing Mosman Lightning at Bremner Park. Mosman won the toss and elected to bat and were bowled out for a modest 118 off 30.4 overs. Some very tight bowling and

fielding throughout saw only one of their batsmen score above 20 before being dismissed by strike bowler Sean O'Farrell. The wickets were shared and it was a real team performance with 2 catches each to Flanagan and Hoffman and a stumping and a catch by James Veitch. We were immediately put under pressure with the bat with both openers being dismissed quickly and finding ourselves at 6/60 after 16 overs and under some pressure. A calming 35 no by Harry Quirk turned things around and cameos by Liam Zucconi 20no and Charlie Hoffman 18no at numbers 9 and 10 brought us home with 4 overs to spare.

Round 9 was washed out and Round 10 saw us playing North Sydney White at Pottery Green – our first “home game” of the season – 10 weeks into the season. North Sydney won the toss and elected to bat scoring 7/146, a very respectable total and the highest against us so far. Ethan's 2/11 off 3 and Flynn's 2/12 off 4 and Charlie's 2/14 off 4 were the pick of the bowling. Having lost Alex and Will early Conor steadied the ship with a fine 38 no before Ollie Morris 27 and James Veitch 30no brought us home at 5/147 off 25.3 overs.

The final round before the summer break was against Lindfield Chappell at Newport (somewhere very close to both of us!). Lane Cove won the toss and elected to bat. Aled Morris 13no and Liam Zucconi 24no opened and got us off to a great start before we lost our first wicket at 60 off 11 overs. Conor 35no, Alex 20, James 23no and Will 21no all scored quickly enabling us to post our highest score of the season of 4/192. Our bowling whilst tight was ineffective and Lindfield finished at 4/106 off 32.

The team had done fantastically well to reach this point of the season and be unbeaten, the only team in the competition to be in that position.

Round 12 in late January saw us playing Lane Cove Ponting for the second time, this time at Pottery Green. Lane Cove Thommo won the toss and elected to bat, scoring 8/121, one of our lowest totals of the season. Harry Quirk's 35no, Alex's 19 and Conor's 15 were the main contributors. Again some wonderful tight bowling by all in the team saw us limit Ponting to 8/95. Charlie's 3/7 (all bowled) off 5 overs was magnificent. For those who saw it Ollie Morris' catch in the outfield running backwards off Alex's bowling was equally memorable.

Round 13 against St Pius White was washed out. St Ives Ponting at Morrison Bay Park were next. They won the toss and were bowled out for 92 in 25 overs. 3 bowlers did the damage, Flynn Mahoney's opening spell to dismiss the top 3 batsmen was a highlight leaving him with figures of 3/8 off 4, Sean O'Farrell's deadly swing saw him clean-up the middle order with 3/13 off 2 before Alex Sidhu's 3/7 off 4 finished things off. Thommo went in to bat and scored 93 runs in 17 overs for the loss of just 3 wickets. Conor Fahey played a masterful innings of 38no including 2 6's with Charlie Hoffman 15no in support.

Round 15 saw us at Kent Oval up against St Ives Warne who were in 4th spot on the ladder. Lane Cove Thommo batted first and scored 8/188 off 32. After scoring only 63 in the first 16 overs we posted 125 off the next 16 with Conor's 36 no (including 3 6's) Alex's 33, James' 26 no the highlights. Missing our strike bowler, Charlie Hoffman, we struggled for our usual dominance and St Ives were able to score 156 with one of their batsmen scoring a fine 50. Alex Sidhu's 3/18 off 5 was the highpoint in the field.

In the last competition round we played North Sydney Black at Pottery Green. Lane Cove Thommo won the toss and batted first scoring 5/143. Liam 31no and Ollie 23no got the team off to a strong start before Luka 25; Charlie 19no and Flynn 16no moved things along in support. A tight bowling

performance saw them dismissed for 86 in 26 overs. Alex with 3/10 off 4 was the pick of the bowlers.

So at the end of 16 rounds Lane Cove Thommo had won 14 matches with the remaining two being washed out and were Minor Premiers.

The semi-final against St Ives Ponting, whom we'd beaten only 3 weeks previously, was unfortunately washed out and as the highest ranked team we went straight into the Grand Final.

The Grand Final was played at Pottery Green against Mosman Lightning, who had a strong finish to the season. Lane Cove Thommo won the toss and elected to bat. Despite the early loss of Liam for a duck and Conor for 11, James Veitch 35no and Harry Quirk 35no knuckled down to make a real game of it. A solid middle order contribution from the captain, Patrick 21, provided Will 34 no and Charlie 26 the platform for us to post a very competitive 6/177. At this point we knew that if we bowled to our ability we could bring it home.

The two openers got Mosman off to a strong start with them not losing a wicket until 45 but the tightness of the bowling (Charlie 0/2 off 4 overs in particular) meant that by the halfway point they had scored only 53 runs but required a further 125. 3 middle order runouts by Ollie, Flynn and Alex swung the game decisively Thommo's way and when Luka took the final catch off Alex's bowling to close out the innings the game and the championship were won.

They had an outstanding season and played as a team throughout. The boys were delighted and coaching staff and parents relieved that the promise and the talent had been delivered on and the disappointment of 2011 erased. The pleasing thing for the coaching staff was the development that took place over the season for all the boys. They were a great group of boys and a credit to the club.
